October 28, 29 & 30

Over 400 eager genealogy researchers gathered at the **Grand Traverse Resort** to take part in the Michigan Genealogical Council's annual genealogy conference. The friendly and helpful folks of the Grand Traverse Genealogy Society were our hosts. It was a gorgeous weekend in Traverse and the staff and facilities at the Grand Traverse Resort were great.

The MGS was well represented at the conference with President Joan Brausch, MGC delegate Kathy Bohl, Bill Kocher, Bob Mass, Ruth Ann Casadonte and Virginia Parsons present.

Our two main speakers were Henry (Hank) Z. Jones and Cyndi Howells. Hank is best known for his 30 year research into the Palatine Germans who came to the USA in the early 1700's. He has written two books on their ancestry and migration. Hank has also written Psychic Roots, a book about using intuition in genealogy research. A very insightful and engrossing work!

September 15, 1999 MGS Meeting Speaker: Shirley J. Hodges "Ethnic Migration to Michigan"

"Michigan provided a handful of resources to provide a better life for immigrants" - so began Shirley Hodges very informative program on the migration of various ethnic groups to Michigan. The great majority of immigrant groups she discussed were from a variety of European countries - both eastern and western.

Immigrants came to **Michigan** for a variety of reasons - to seek adventure, to avoid military service, to seek opportunity, to escape oppression, to provide a better life for their families. People came in groups - some representing family groups, some representing communities and some representing specific religious groups. People immigrated to areas that provided opportunities that were familiar to them, for example British miners settled in the upper penisula where they built and worked copper and iron ore mines; Dutch settled in western Michigan near Lake Michigan; Danish lumbermen migrated to mid-Michigan where timber was plentiful; German farmers settled in the fertile areas of Wayne and Saginaw Counties.

The first immigrants to Michigan in the early 1700's were French fur traders. Italian immigrants came in 1701 as coal miners.

During the 1800's and early 1900's immigrants settled in Michigan from Germany, Denmark, Finland, Sweden, the Netherlands, Hungary, Armenia, Poland, Belgium, the Holy Land, Italy, Russia, France, the British Isles, etc. In the mid-1800's the thumb area of Michigan had a large population of Canadians who freely moved across the U.S. border.

Of historical significance to genealogists was the great fire of 1871. The fire burned from Lake Michigan to Lake Huron leaving a swath of burned forest and destroyed property across central Michigan. Many records were destroyed along with the lives and occupations of many immigrants. The lumber industry virtually perished in the blaze resulting in new hardships and new challenges.

Immigrants to Michigan were brave, hardworking groups of people seeking a better life for themselves and their families. People who were willing to work found their lives to be rich and fruitful.

October 20, 1999 MGS Meeting Speaker: Doug Applegath "Researching in Canada"

At the October 20 meeting of the Midland Genealogy Society, **Doug Applegath**, one of our members, gave a presentation on how to best research in **Canada**, especially in **Ontario**. He began his talk by noting that many, many native Michiganders have roots in Canada - and those present agreed wholeheartedly. A majority of the people present had ancestors from Canada.

Doug told us about the migration paths into Canada and then discussed how to best research in Ontario, what records could be researched in which place, and gave some tips on Internet research in Ontario.

Doug, thank you for sharing the insights you have gleaned from your own research in Canada!

COMMENTS

Most items are self explanatory.

The annual budget process is complicated by the MGS book sales process. Publication costs are absorbed in one year while sales may occur for several years. Typical of this is the book "Midland Pioneers" which cost \$1509.58 to publish 200 copies in 98-99 and zero in 1999-2000. Sales may continue for several years.

Another difference from one year to the next is the cost of seminars and workshops. Last years included outside speakers and therefore expenses were higher. This year's workshop will be presented by local MGS members volunteering their time and expertise.

This year our budget is not only less than last year, but our income should exceed our expenses.

The donations put in the glass jar by MGS members at each meeting are forwarded to NARA, which is the National Archive & Records Administration. NARA utilizes the donations to compile and archive genealogical and historical data.

BY-LAWS MIDLAND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY MIDLAND, MICHIGAN

Revised 21 March 1990

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the organization shall be "The Midland Genealogical Society" hereinafter called "the Society."

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The purpose of the Society shall be to serve as a focal point for genealogical activities in the Midland County area. The Society shall do this through such activities as collecting and preserving local genealogical and historical records, accumulating genealogical materials from other places, and making these materials accessible to the public. Further, the Society shall stimulate interest in genealogy in the community and shall educate the membership and the general public in methods of genealogical research and give mutual assistance to the members in their research efforts.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Any person interested in any phase of the purpose may become a member by requesting membership and paying the annual dues. Only members whose dues have been paid shall have the privilege of voting.

Honorary Membership may be conferred upon any person whom the membership deems worthy, but such Honorary Membership shall not be conferred upon more than two members in any fiscal year, and shall require a majority vote at any regular meeting. Honorary members shall have all the privileges of regular members including voting but shall not be required to pay dues.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

The officers of the Society shall be President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Historian, and two delegates to the Michigan Genealogical Council.

A nominating committee appointed by the President shall present a slate of officers at the April meeting to be voted upon at the annual meeting. The officers shall be elected at the annual meeting by the membership and shall take office at the close of said meeting. The term of office shall be for one year with privilege of re-election.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- 1. The duties of the officers shall be such as are indicated by their respective titles and such as are specified in the By-Laws.
- 2. The President shall appoint committees as required and shall be a member ex officio of all committees, without right to vote. The President's signature shall be recorded as an alternate on the bank account.
- 3. The First Vice-President shall be Program Chairman and perform the duties of the President in the absence or inability of that officer to serve.
- 4. The Second Vice-President shall be Membership Chairman and maintain a current membership list with addresses, and shall actively promote new members. The Second Vice-President shall also work with the Program Chairman in the selection of the Society's programs.
- 5. The Recording Secretary shall take minutes and maintain a permanent file of said minutes. He/she shall submit a copy of the minutes to the presiding officer within two weeks of the recording.
- 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall write thank-you notes to the speakers and deal with such other correspondence as designated by the President.
- 7. The Treasurer shall chair the Budget Committee, collect all dues, attend to all disbursements and have charge of all funds. He/she shall keep all the accounts and report in full the receipts and disbursements to date upon the request of the presiding officer.

In the absence of the Treasurer, the President may make disbursements for the Society for budgeted items.

- 8. The Historian shall be the custodian of all historical information concerning the Society.
- 9. The two Michigan Genealogical Council Delegates shall attend all Council meetings deemed necessary by the membership and shall report back to the Society.

10. All officers, upon retiring from office, shall deliver to their successors all monies, accounts, records, books, papers, or other property which belongs to the organization.

ARTICLE VI BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A Board of Directors shall consist of all elected officers (9) and the immediate past President. The Board shall meet at the call of the President or any two other Board members.

The Board may conduct routine business on behalf of the Society in periods between meetings and may make recommendations at the monthly meetings of the Society.

The Board may consider and advise on matters of policy and take whatever actions are necessary or expedient in the control of the affairs of the Society.

Five Directors shall constitute a quorum at a Board meeting.

ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

Regular meetings shall be held on the third Wednesday of each month with the exception of June, July, August and December. The date of such meetings may be changed as agreed upon by the membership.

The annual meeting shall be held in May. The election of officers and the adoption of the yearly budget shall be conducted at the annual meeting.

Twenty percent of the membership shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VIII DUES

Annual dues shall be \$10.00 for individual memberships and \$12.50 for family memberships (with only one copy of the Piorieer Record, per family.

Annual dues become due for the ensuing year on July 1. Members who have not paid their dues by September 30 shall be dropped.

After January 1, dues for new members shall be half the above amount. Those new members joining after April 1 shall pay full dues which shall also apply to the ensuing year.

ARTICLE IX FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year shall begin July 1 and extend through the following June 30.

ARTICLE X PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, will be followed.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS


These By-laws may be amended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided that proposed amendments shall have been presented in writing to the membership and discussed at the previous regular meeting. Members not present at such previous meeting shall be notified that amendments to the By-laws will be voted upon at the next regular meeting.


