WHERE ARE YOU GOING? WHERE HAVE YOU BEEN?

Chicagoing: Bureau of Vital Statistics by Dolores Rouse  
The Bureau of Vital Statistics is located in the Cook County Building at 118 North Clark St., between Washington St. and Randolph St; access is by the Randolph St. entrance and escalator to the Lower

Concourse. The name of the current County Clerk is Stanley T. Kusper, Jr. Correspondence should be addressed to Mr. Kusper as follows:

Procedure for obtaining copies of the records gives a choice of waiting in the Bureau for them or having the copies mailed to whatever address you wish. The fee in 1980 was \$3 per copy and included postage if mailing was specified on the application form. Payment of the fee at the Bureau can be by cash, travelers' checks and maybe by credit card; but absolutely not by personal check drawn on any out-of-city bank (this policy prevails almost everywhere in Chicago and such checks are not even cashed by city's banks). I don't know if checks drawn on Chicago banks will be accepted as fee payment.

Separate forms are provided for each type of record and make different requirements for data; but all have space to state the number of copies of a particular record and a space to indicate whether you wish to wait for the "search-and-copy" or want the copy/copies mailed to you. Choose the appropriate form, fill out carefully, pay fee to cashier who will stamp the upper portion as your receipt; then, bring the receipted form to one of the clerks and (if you have chosen to wait) inform him/her of this so that you will be given a "call number" and directed to the waiting area (plenty of seating available) until your copy is made and your "call number" announced. Waiting for a "search-and-copy" requires some time and patience so bring a difficult crossword puzzle to do, socks to mend, or your teddy bear to keep you from getting crazy.

The last time I was at the Bureau, I took some extra forms for future use (as I gather more data, I'll fill them out at home and bring them with me on next trip). As I was leaving, I intended to copy the Bureau's business hours but in the corridor outside the Marriage License Bureau, a bride-to-be was trying to dot the "i" in Illinois with the groom-to-be's head (difference of opinion as to who should pay for license) and this was so interesting that I forgot to get the information about hours. Next trip, I'll do that first and then pass it on to you sometime.
